Journey to Medical School

- Graduated FSU with degree in Athletic Training
- Decided to become a doctor during undergrad after a baseball field collision that rendered a draftee a quadriplegic
- Originally applied to medical school senior year of college, but didn't get accepted
- Worked as an NCAA athletic trainer for local colleges and waited tables for 3 years
- Reapplied again as an adult with work experience—and married!

Every challenge was vital to my journey to become a doctor.



Journey to Medical School – The MCAT

- Took the MCAT 3 times
- One score was a 25 (499), one score was voided, and the third score was a 32 (32)
- Took a course the first time, but then relied on his known study habits for the third time
- At this point, students should already know how to be academically successful and apply those tools to their MCAT prep

The key is to understand how you learn and what works best for <u>you</u>.



Medical School Experience

- Attended East Carolina University Brody School of Medicine
- Served 3 years on the Admissions Committee
- Fun but tough
- Had first child while in med school
- Having a great partner made being married while in med school much easier
- First rotation was internal medicine
- Forced me to face my own mortality early on

Residency

- Currently an anesthesiology resident at UPMC in Pittsburgh
- The residency application process is nothing like med school
- Went on 20+ interviews
- Prepare to get wined and dined....before the real work begins
- Residency itself, however, is anything but glamorous.
- You will be pushed beyond your comfort zone

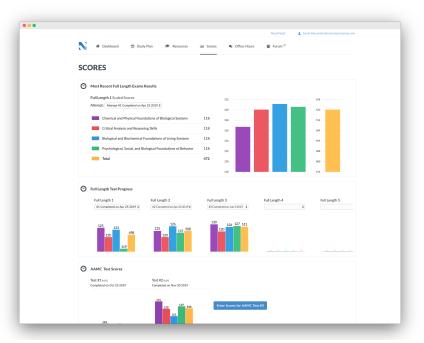

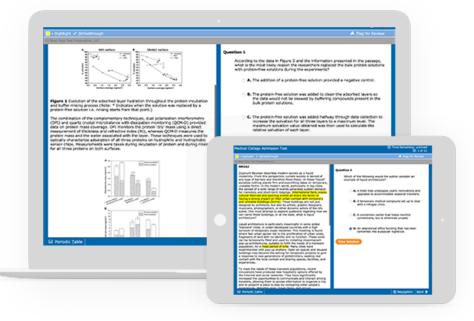
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
